Description

Max Le Verrier (1891-1973) - Art Deco sculpture rope athlete, France 1937 Art Deco sculpture depicting an athlete pulling a rope, by Max Le Verrier (1891-1973), made in France around 1937. Executed in art metal (antimony) with a dark patina, this sculpture rests on a carved stone base, bringing stability and elegance to the whole. The dynamic attitude of the figure, captured in effort, powerfully expresses the values cherished by the Art Deco aesthetic: power, mastery of the body and elegance of movement. The stylized treatment of volumes, the muscular tension and the clean line testify to the expertise of Max Le Verrier, a major figure in the Parisian Art Deco movement. A pupil of Marcel Bouraine in particular, and a close friend of Pierre Le Faguays, he established himself as one of the
