Each tapestry is enhanced by a deep blue and gold marbled paper passe-partout and gold, creating a contrast the colors and the delicacy of the composition..Dimensions:as viewed tapestry view: 42 cm x 52 cm.Maxi of the frame : 61 cm x 81 cm.The tapestries are from the mid-18th century.Frames are from the second half of the 19th century, with their original glass. original glass.The gilding was renovated in the 20th century.Some scratches and cracks scratches,

The Aubusson tapestry, with its great finesse of execution, imitates the pictorial rendering of a painting in the "singeries" style, in vogue in the 18th century. XVIIIth century. La Fontaine's fables of La Fontaine were a source of inspiration in the 18th century for the decorative arts, combining erudition and refined aesthetics.
