Description

Wooden frame (wear and tear). Frame size: 40 x 53 cm. Gouache on cardboard, signed on the back. Dimensions: 27 x 40 cm. Govind Madhav Solegaonkar (1912-1986). Solegaonkar was born in 1912 in Sehore, India, in the state of Madhya Pradesh, and studied in Indore and Bombay. He then joined the Sir Jamsetjee Jeejeebhoy School of Art in Bombay (which was also the school of M. F. Husain, S. H. Raza, V. S. Gaitonde). Between 1934 and 1937, he was a member of the Indore group with N.S. Bendre, D. J. Joshi, and M. S. Joshi, a group whose influence was in Bombay. He was awarded the Gold Medal of the Bombay Art Society in 1935 and won the India Art Society of India trophy in 1953. Solegaonkar specialized in murals, portraits and landscapes. The artist is

never satisfied and experiments with different styles, from realism to abstract and simplification of form to an explosion of color. In 1958, the artist left India for Europe, traveling to Holland, England and Belgium. returned a few years later, his style had totally changed. He exhibited at Jehangir Art Gallery in 1962 and at Taj Art Gallery in 1970. In July 1971, 40 of his works were exhibited at India House in London. He died on January 5, 1986. works were shown at The Rajya Sabha in New Delhi, the Tata Institute of Fundamental Research and the CSMVS Museum in Bombay.
