The mark "F L" corresponds to the stamp of François LIEUTAUD (1665-1748), received Master the end of the 17th century, Hewith Charles Boulle, executed some of Versailles' finest furniture. The records indicate that, as an exceptional measure, King Louis XIV granted him XIV had granted him the rare privilege of being able to create and manufacture the bronzes for his furniture, because at the time, only the corporation of had this exclusivity. In History of Furniture, the use of walnut for the construction of drawers drawers, as is the case with our chest of drawers, bears witness to Parisian Parisian craftsmanship, and on the other hand, it's a piece of furniture commissioned piece of furniture. More later, with the shortage of walnut following the harsh winter of 1709, walnut was replaced by oak. François LIEUTAUD was one of the greatest cabinetmakers of his time. To date, we find very few works by him on the market, which makes our chest of drawers, described below, a rare piece of furniture.
