Description

An important and rare solid bronze work of considerable density, weighing 3.7 kg, signed Tadatsugu (?), depicting a naturalistic scene in high relief of Chidori (a type of bird) moving among pine trees. This piece testifies to the excellence of late 19th-century Japanese metalwork, poetically capturing the dynamism of nature. Notable details include contrasting silver inlays against the brown patina, the Mitsudomoe symbol on the tile, and the presence of a finely chiseled spider, all hallmarks of high-quality workshop work strongly reminiscent of the Nogawa Workshop. The extreme finesse of the details, particularly in the birds' plumage, reveals a technical mastery worthy of the finest workshops in Kyoto or Tokyo. Weighing 3.7 kg and measuring 37 cm in diameter, this piece
