It could be from the Manufacture de la Reine. We have sold signed pieces from this factory, whose decoration of the same type is very similar in terms of quality. The Manufacture dite de la Reine rue Thiroux was founded in 1776 by André Leboeuf. In 1778, Leboeuf announced to his customers that "La Reine honor their establishment with her protection and allow it to bear her august name bear her august name, each newly manufactured piece will henceforth be marked with a crowned A, the first letter of Her Majesty's name. The Manufacture de la Reine is one of the many Paris manufacturers that sought the

protection of a member of the Royal family to obtain a privilege and the prestige of a name and coat of arms which they could display on their storefronts and invoices. The prominent character received substantial financial rewards. Such was the case of Provence, the Count of Artois, the Duke of Orleans duc d'Orléans, the queen and even the very young 6-year-old duc d'Angoulême. This system disappeared with the abolition of privileges during the French Revolution. Queen Marie Antoinette ordered services from the factory for her apartments at Fontainebleau, the Tuileries and the Château de Trianon. Our is in very good condition with no flaws or accidents.
