Created at the end of the 19th century, this subject with its brown patina is in the taste of Paul-Édouard Delabrière (1829 - 1910), although unsigned. He specialized in casting and bronze animals in realistic postures, often during important events in the animal's life (as here, the stag's bellow). His works were influenced by Antoine-Louis Barye. Animal subjects in Bronze from the 19th century are classics for collectors of display objects, and bronze. Adopt without further ado this powerful scene from the life of a stag, frozen in
