Ancient Dotaku (Japanese bronze ritual bell) from the Yayoi period, dating from around 200 A.D. It has a magnificent burial patina. These ancient artifacts were made only during the Yayoi period, from 300 B.C. to 300 A.D. Initially inspired by continental sound models, these bells evolved in Japan into larger, thinner shapes, losing their acoustic function to become purely symbolic symbols. C. to 300 A.D.
