Description

A monumental Austrian "Amphora" pottery vase, produced in Turn-Teplitz, Bohemia, circa 1895-1910. At 51 cm high, this is an unusually large and visually commanding example from Amphora's finest artistic years.

Its tall flaring silhouette, sculptural base, and sweeping openwork handles are enhanced by a remarkable pierced olive-green collar requiring extensive hand-finishing. Stylised scrollwork, foliate ornament, suspended teardrop details, and moulded relief decoration create a rich sculptural surface.

The ivory, olive, rose-brown, and gilt palette reflects Amphora's premium decorative production. The underside bears the Amphora crown mark with AUSTRIA and model number 12000.
