Description

Seventeenth-century portrait of a noblewoman, marquise or countess in the Grand Siècle, during the reign of Louis XIV. She is shown in bust form, wearing a precious gown with golden highlights, embellished with a delicate bodice of fine lace, and a draped coat in deep green-blue hues. She is coiffed according to the codes of the time: her hair pulled back on her head and held in place by a red ribbon, a hairstyle known as "à la Fontanges", after the young marquise who introduced it to Versailles. This high-quality, unsigned painting is comparable to the court portraits painted by the great painters of Louis XIV's time, such as De Troy and Mignard. This portrait of a noblewoman perfectly illustrates the classical aesthetic of the Grand Siècle, combining distinction, restraint and harmony. This painting is
