Typical 17th century blade frequently found in Europe mounted on Italian Italian Schiavonas, Scottish boadswords to Hungarian and Polish from Hungary and Poland. Blades that were obviously heavily exported and prized in North Africa, as they are frequently found mounted on 17th century nimchas. At the level of the ricasso, presence of an Arab workshop hallmark. Probably the workshop that mounted the blade on the horn handle. At the level of the ricasso, presence of an Arabic workshop stamp. Probably Italian blade in view of the serrated eyelashes common below the back of the blade. Single-edged straight blade with counter-edge on the last third. Horn handle. The
