The bearded male faces frequently feature protective deities, heroes or figures inspired by Egyptian and Greek models, which had a profound influence on Phoenician art..The modelling of the face, the stylized beard and the vitrified material bear witness to the remarkable skill of ancient Mediterranean craftsmen in working with pâte de verre.The head is presented on a modern wooden
