This exceptional object testifies to the production of quality writing objects in the late Middle Ages in the former Netherlands..The central decoration features an armorial shield adorned with a lion, unambiguously identified as the Lion of Flanders. The rim as well as the underside are richly decorated with geometric motifs, mainly composed of lozenges and triangles, typical of the region's Gothic decorative repertoire. The object was made in the late 19th century. The object was discovered in the Netherlands and was the subject of a publication in the Dutch journal Tinnewerck
