These delicate flasks were intended to contain precious perfumes. They are characterized by a flattened globular body, a long, extremely narrow neck designed to limit evaporation, and two small side handles. These delicate flasks were designed to hold precious perfumes. The example presented here stands out for its remarkable state of preservation: it is exceptionally intact considering the great fragility of this type of medieval glassware.
