You can find some frames identical to the one shown. The last photo shows the painting executed by Mme Lebrun in 1776 in Pastel which is currently conserved at the Domaine de Marly. In that year, she produced 41 paintings (youthful works), including this portrait of Madame Savalette de Magnanville. This young woman is shown in a pink silk dress, softened by a bouilloné of white gauze at the arms and around the décolleté. The décolleté and

LE MODELE As evidenced by her portrait and everything we know about the other members of this family, Antoinette Savalette de Magnanville belonged to the elegant and brilliant society of the late 18th century, a society devoted to the arts, which Madame Vigée Le Brun frequented and painted. Who are the Savalettes de Magnanville? They belonged to a dynasty of mustard-makers already known under Louis XIV. Sébastien Mercier cites them in 1775 in his comedy in his comedy *La brouette des moutardiers*: "...it's not such a bad trade, Savalette and Lecomte made their fortune there... Madame de Magnanville married Marc Antoine Duplex du Pernan in 1766
