This model perfectly illustrates this prestigious savoir-faire: The Kikusui motif: Delicate chrysanthemums treated in gold and dark hues, floating on stylized streams of water. Symbolism: The presence of Manji medallions, ancestral symbols of peace and prosperity. The Nashiji finish: The reverse side of the tray and the bottom feature the famous "pear skin" technique. Gold flakes are sprinkled with precision under several layers of translucent lacquer, creating a shimmering depth that catches the light magnificently. Sold with its wooden box
