## Silverware, Silver Sugar Bowl Louis XVI Style, Late 18th Century Hallmarks

### Description

A silver sugar bowl and lid, cobalt blue glass, standing on four claw feet, Louis XVI style. The gallery is pierced with medallions, one engraved with an intertwined monogram, in a surround of rose garlands and garlands of roses and olive foliage, the double handles with pearl mouldings. The domed lid is composed of a hollow gadroon groove, a string of pearls and a silver dome. The removable handle, attached to the lid by its nut, features two wood cutters on a terrace of repoussé leaves. The cobalt-blue glass verrine glass is original. Goldsmith's hallmarks, charge and discharge including a "grand A couronné" for Paris, Henry Clavel's first by Henry Clavel (late 18th century), under the lid and under the mount. Please note: tiny small dents and scratches.
