Because of its typology, this example can easily be dated to the 15th century. It features two side handles and a decoration entirely covered with particularly decorative checkerboard patterns. These little dinettes were made in the Middle Ages. These little dinettes were generally made by bimblotiers, craftsmen specializing in small pewter objects, known in particular for making medieval pilgrimage signs. Toys of this type are extremely
