Description

This winter landscape, painted in the late 19th century by an unidentified, yet talented European artist, reveals to us the ringing silence of a snow-covered forest in the anticipation of approaching twilight. The artist masterfully builds the perspective, dissolving the background in a silvery-blue frosty haze: the rut of the road leads the viewer's gaze deep into the forest, where a small lonely figure of a peasant woman is seen walking with a bundle of brushwood on her back among the mighty tree trunks. This detail makes us feel the incredible fragility of a human before the silent majesty of nature. In the foreground, fluffy snowdrifts, an ice-bound stream, and the branches of shrubs, bent under the weight of snow, are painted almost tangibly. Every detail in this work conveys a deep state of peace of the
