Elegant Art Deco chryselephantine sculpture attributed to Ferdinand Preiss, depicting a young woman with tambourine reclining gracefully on a veined brown marble base. The figure is crafted in gilded bronze and ivory, using the chryselephantine technique emblematic of 1920-1930 creations. Submitted with CITES document. Ferdinand Preiss (1882-1943) was one of the most famous German sculptors of the Art Deco period. Based in Berlin, he made a name for himself with his chryselephantine sculptures combining bronze and ivory, mainly depicting dancers, cabaret performers and elegant female figures. His works, inspired by the refined aesthetics of the Roaring Twenties, are today highly sought-after by Art Deco collectors. Features Era: circa 1925-1935 Style: Art
