Berlin Schinkel's interpretation of Neo-classism
veered toward the Grecian, this influence is in his
designs for furniture and furnishings. He
specialised & was a leading
innovator in creating wonderful furniture from
Iron & gilt metal and used
large scale neoclassical motifs in his inspired
designs In 1830 he was
appointed Director of the Prussian Office of
Public Works, where he decorated
apartments for Crown Prince Friedrich Wilhelm
