Pair of Japanese bronze vases with champlevé enamel - Meiji period (1868-1912) Elegant pair of baluster-shaped Japanese vases in patinated bronze, richly polychrome champlevé enamels with stylized floral decoration in the taste of Meiji period Japanese art. Each vase features, on the belly, a large iris decoration in relief in shades of blue, green and wine-red, framed by friezes of cloisonné enamels with finely worked plant motifs. They are formed by two stylized birds in patinated bronze, bringing a sculptural and decorative character to the set. High-quality Japanese work from the Meiji period (1868-1912), renowned for the refinement of its decorative arts and the virtuosity of its enamel workshops. Beautiful old patina and very decorative.
