### Description

Copper madeleine mold from the kitchens of King Louis Philippe 1st for his Château de Bizy. Bearing on the side the king's monogram "L.P." under a royal crown, as well as the inscription "Bizy" and the date "1845". L.: approx. 8 cm - H.: approx. 4 cm

The Château de Bizy is a residence located in Vernon, in the Normandy region of France. The château is partially listed as a historic monument. In 1817, the Duchesse d'Orléans bought back her property, which had been sold during the Revolution. She returned to Bizy, where her son, who became Louis-Philippe I in 1830, inherited the estate on his death in 1821. He had two wings restored, the old buildings, created an English-style park and planted numerous trees, including a remarkable

catalpa. He stayed there often, sometimes traveling there by rail when the line to Vernon in 1843, as evidenced by one of his handwritten letters.
