Description

Suite of four drawings depicting L'empereur Napoléon I à Saint Hélène signed Nicolas Toussaint Charlet (1792-1845). The four scenes are annotated as follows: -"The Emperor complaining to the Grand Marshal and General Gourgaud about the outrages Hudson Low is inflicting on him" -"The Emperor's Last Moments (May 5, 1821) - "Hudson Low coming to see for himself that the Emperor is dead"- "The Emperor's tomb at Saint Helena" These extremely fine drawings are the work of Nicolas Toussaint Charlet, a fervent supporter of the Empire and a pupil of Gros. He quickly excelled as a draughtsman rather than as a painter, and his subjects of choice were guided by his political opinions. Many of his works are preserved in French museums.
