The frame retains a wonderfully warm antique gilded surface with visible traces of the original red bole beneath the gilding, adding depth and authenticity to the piece. The proportions are refined and balanced, giving the mirror a timeless architectural elegance that works beautifully in both traditional and contemporary interiors. The mirror appears to retain its original mercury glass, recognizable by its characteristic depth, softly shimmering
