Featuring a generous amount of curved movement on four curved feet with scrolls, typical of the rocaille repertoire. The repoussé and chased decoration features delicate asymmetrical shells, leafy clasps and cartouches framed by floral garlands inspired by the Louis XV taste. The sinuous accentuate the elegance and lightness of the ensemble. The center features a blank cartouche for a coat of arms or a monogram, a detail much sought-after by goldsmiths. Its removable metal interior, perfectly fits precisely into the cut-out of the jardinière, and fits in perfectly impeccably. It was originally designed to hold flower arrangements or refreshers, while preserving the solid silver. The quality of its chasing, the balance of its
