Probably Austrian or Italian, 19th century Rare and elegant pair of finely chased and gilded bronze, featuring a particularly theatrical and ornamental composition of neoclassical inspiration. Each piece rests on a tripod base finished with powerful lion claws, the traditional symbol of strength and sovereignty. The uprights are formed by three leaning eagles with nervous modeling and stylized wings, evoking the imperial iconography inherited from Roman Antiquity and widely in the decorative arts of Central Europe in the 19th century. The central shaft is punctuated by a large faceted pine cone. In the ancient symbolic repertoire, the pine cone refers to fertility, eternity and spiritual rebirth.
