Description

This figure probably comes from a rood screen or altarpiece. The use of horns is attested in all the world's religions and in the Bible, for example; these instruments appear in over 100 texts. They are mentioned in psalms and hymns. The Bible, and more particularly the New Testament, speaks of the return of Christ and the Messiah awaited by the Jews. Blowing horns symbolizes the presence of Yahweh, God.
