Description

In 1875, together with Ettore Roesler Franz, Pio Joris, and Cesare Biseo, he founded the "Society of Roman Watercolorists." In 1880, he traveled to England, where he studied English landscape painters. He lived in London until 1891, when he returned to Rome and joined the "In Arte Libertas" association. After its dissolution, he founded the "XXV della Campagna Romana" group with other artists, becoming its most prominent member. He befriended the Tuscan painter Cesare Bertolla, with whom he visited the Maccarese marshes, where the waters reflected the splendor of the sky. In 1899, he participated in the Third International Art Exhibition in Venice. On April 18, 1908, he was initiated into Freemasonry in Italy at the Rienzi Lodge in Rome.
