Dimensions : Height: 18 cm Width: 21 cm Depth: 4.5 cm Good overall state of preservation in view of antiquity Fragmentary as visible on photographs Presence of wear, minor chips and old concretions Important Roman architectural fragment in molded terracotta featuring an elegant decoration of stylized scrolls and acanthus leaves in slight relief. The surface retains interesting early traces of white stucco and vestiges of polychromy. Acanthus decoration, directly inherited from Greek and then Roman ornamental vocabulary, is one of the great classical motifs of ancient imperial architecture. Comparable decorations
