Virgin Mary is shown in prayer, eyes raised towards heaven, with clouds underneath her. Beautiful sensitive modelling of the face. Other versions of this composition are signed with monogram "IL", referring to Jacques Laudin the Elder of Jacques Laudin the Younger, generally attributed to Jacques Laudin II (c.1663-1729).
