Suite of 4 mahogany chairs mahogany with curved backrest adorned with a tripod Athenian resting on goat hooves. Beautiful, elegant decoration profiled in curves and counter-curves, carved from all angles: sophisticated yet presenting a false simplicity. Work from the Directoire period, very late 18th century, circa 1795-1800. The 4 chairs are stamped Demay rue de Clery. Jean-Baptiste Bernard Demay (1759-1848), master in 1784, was one of the leading who, like most of his colleagues, practiced on rue de Cléry in Paris. Like most of his colleagues. Although he began his career under the Ancien régime, he quickly achieved success, supplying Queen Marie-Antoinette (Petit Trianon). He continued his career after the revolution, changing his stamp to "Demay rue
