Description

Rectangular hardwood coffee table, with open structure and sober decoration, resting on a framed base. This type of furniture is traditionally used in Chinese interiors as a reception table or kang table. The table features a rectangular top with a slightly raised frame, highlighting a central panel with subtly wavy horizontal veining. The surface is covered in a dark brown lacquer with deep reflections, revealing the natural nuances of the wood. The base is openworked with an off-cut geometric decoration, forming a play of angular lines typical of the decorative vocabulary inspired by Ming models. The legs, with their rectangular cross-section, are linked by low crosspieces forming an open frame, ensuring both stability and visual lightness. The ensemble takes up the aesthetic principles of Ming dynasty
