### Description

- Hammered, chased and melted silver- Paris, 1713-1717- Diameter : 13.7cm ; height : 1.9 cm- Weight : 262g (129g & 133g) - No goldsmith's hallmark- Very good condition, 19th century coat of arms- Pair of small round dishes sedged with a filleted molding adorned with thirty-two pinched ribs. The center is adorned with a marquis's coat of arms for the Blandin family - This pair of small dishes like this is typical of the tableware dedicated to "fruit service", described as such in the inventories of the french Crown [Guiffrey] or represented in the plate "Table mise pour le dessert sur laquelle sont présentés des fruits en pyramide "by François Massialot, published in 1715, which features a large number of these around a symmetrical composition of pyramid-shaped bowls.
