well-crafted work to suggest the presence of a great artist, i.e. "an excellent hand" as we say in the jargon of experts and art dealers: a priori the canvas doesn't seem to be signed but there are like traces of writing down the middle / see last shot? - it would be necessary to look for the author among the painters of the South-West and more particularly the artists of the Bordeaux School - Canvas size: 81 cm x 65 cm - ask me for other clichés if need be -
