The ARTIST Jean-Baptiste Le Paon, born Jean-Baptiste Louis Lepaon, was a French painter born March 15, 1738 in Paris and died May 27, 1785 in the same city. He began his artistic career in his youth thanks to an uncle who was also a painter, and apprenticed with Francesco Casanova, a Venetian battle painter. Initially a cavalry officer, he gave up his military career to devote himself to painting until his death in 1785. His famous works include "The Prince of Nassau hunting a jaguar" of 1784, currently on display at the Lazienki Palace in Warsaw.
