Small child's pole paddle collected on the banks of the Sepik River in Papua New Guinea. The perch paddle is mainly used to push the pirogue through the sometimes crowded meanders of the Sepik River. The curved shape of the leaf prevents the tip from digging into the mud. Here, a child's paddle. Children learn to handle a pirogue at an early age. Made of wood. Sold with a base. Approx. 100 x 10 cm / EUR200 base and shipping included for Europe.
