Inlaid marble top, white alabaster marble base The polychromatic effect of the marbles, carefully selected and paired, creates a striking interplay of colors that highlights the technical mastery of the artisans, who were able to achieve perfectly polished surfaces and details of extraordinary precision. The edge is finished with understated elegance, further enhancing the complexity of the

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top. The base, crafted from white alabaster marble, features a turned shaft of great elegance, resting on a solid tripod structure. The soft, proportionate lines contribute to giving the whole piece stability and visual lightness, in perfect balance with the decorative richness of the top. A work of great charm and craftsmanship, this small table is a true testament to the excellence of 19th-century Florentine craftsmanship, ideal as a statement piece in classical settings or as a refined contrast in contemporary contexts.
