Gien earthenware circular pie platter with polychrome decoration, peony pattern, late 19th century. Created by the painters & earthenware artisans of the Manufacture de Gien (Loiret, France), this tray with handles in the "Pivoines" décor is a fine example of French quality in the late 19th century. The Manufacture de Gien is an internationally renowned institution in French earthenware & tableware. Founded in 1821 by English industrialist Thomas Edme Hulm, the company's ambition was to create earthenware using French techniques, with an English style. Originating from Gien's golden age at the end of the 19th century, this iconic 'Pivoine' model features flowers from the peony family, native to Japan, in a variety of organic & polychromatic forms inherited from the Art
