18th century school, ink wash Architectural caprice depicting an imaginary view of Castel Sant'Angelo in Rome. In the foreground, men in turbans are busy loading a ship, while one of them smokes a long Ottoman pipe. In the background, Castel Sant'Angelo stands out against a mountainous landscape. The bastioned fortifications erected by Antonio da Sangallo the Elder and the modifications to the castle as a papal residence initiated by Pope Nicholas V are clearly visible. Condition: foxing and pitting mostly localized on the left side of the drawing.
