Description

The Art Deco bronze sculpture of a half-naked dancer was created in the 1920s-1930s by renowned Austrian Art Deco sculptor and ceramist Stephan Dakon (1904 - Vienna - 1997). Stephan Dakon attended a sculpture school and apprenticed at the Vienna Art Foundry. From 1924, through the intermediary of ceramist Josef Lorenzl, he worked at Friedrich Goldscheider's Viennese factory, for whom he created numerous models in the Art Deco style. From 1925 to the mid-1950s, he became one of Goldscheider's most important and creative designers. His specialty was figurative representations of dancers and actresses, including Dolly Sisters, Rita Zabekov, Lilian Harvey, Louise Brooks, as well as the design of female wall masks and representations of children. designs to Viennese ceramics company Keramos and German manufacturers Goebel/Oeslau and Porzellanfabrik Hertwig & Co./Katzhütte.
