Description

Rare blue/white porcelain stoneware long-necked double-gourd bottle from the wreck located off the coast of Hoi An (Vietnam). It has remained "in its juice" after a light cleaning. The numerous marine concretions (barnacles and oysters) have been preserved to testify to its underwater origin. It is complete, with no breaks or cracks. One side is lightly colored orange due to its proximity, in the sediment, to an oxidized ferrous object. The cover has been dulled by five centuries of immersion, but the cobalt-blue decoration remains intact. The typical bottom is painted in iron-red slip. Height: 23 cm. Weight: 670 g. Free shipping to France by Colissimo with signature. Please enquire for other countries. The wreck, discovered at a depth of 70 m and dated to the 15th century, was archaeologically recovered
