Description

Length blade 19cm width 5cm thickness 0.4 cm Large folding knife by Haudeville in Albacete. Second half of the 19th century. This brand was sold in France and Spain. May be produced in France. Spain imported many knives bearing marks such as Valero Jun, Haudeville, Bechona, Beauvoir, etc. The Albacete-type blade features a false edge and curved tip. The locking system is pump-action. Handle covered with red/ochre-tinted bull horn, with flower-shaped nails. The handle is flattened and curved, ending in a rattlesnake shape. Old oxidation on the blade - the opening system is a little hard - minor wear, microchips on the stained plates.
