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emeritus specializing in early painters (Professor K . S) "Dear Eddy, You have a lovely drawing. It's inspired by the Melun diptych painted by Jean Fouquet, in particular the panel preserved in Antwerp (see photo) Signature: and here's the rub, the work is masterfully executed on blue-gray paper (mixed technique) in ink and gouache, and bears an initialled monogram in the lower right-hand corner (see photo), and the style reminds me strongly of René Magritte (surrealism-new realism) before the Second World War. **** This is the only information I have at the moment, as I don't have access to the archives of the Baroness de Becker's collections in New York. ***** Perhaps the future will tell me more.
