Description

Solid silver pitcher of cylindrical form resting on a circular pedestal, fitted with a pinched spout and a spectacular openwork handle with double circular opening forming a geometric sculptural composition. This piece belongs to Jean Puiforcat's rare Mexican production, created after his move to Mexico City during the Second World War. While retaining the modernist architectural vocabulary for which he became renowned in the 1930s, the model shows an evolution towards more monumental and expressive forms. The contrast between the cylindrical purity of the body and the almost abstract treatment of the handle perfectly illustrates this phase of stylistic transition. It is particularly strong visually, evoking certain dialogues between late art deco, constructivism and modernist
