Elegant Louis XVI period confiturier in carved oak, featuring a single door and a drawer above. The cabinet stands on four tapered legs and displays the restrained neoclassical ornamentation characteristic of the late eighteenth century. The façade is enriched with finely carved decorative details including rosettes, stylised leaf borders, diamond-shaped reserves and fluted uprights, all executed with remarkable balance and refinement. The original pierced brass escutcheons further enhance its understated elegance. The oak displays a beautiful grain and an exceptional old patina, warm and deep in tone, highlighting the quality of the carving throughout

the piece. The top retains the natural traces of centuries of use, marks that contribute today to its authenticity and charm. Inside, the cabinet offers practical storage space, while its compact proportions allow it to fit easily into both traditional and contemporary interiors. Good overall condition. Locks present. Key included. Gallery Note Small-scale furniture often possesses a particular charm. Within modest dimensions, it concentrates all the craftsmanship and decorative intelligence of its period. This confiturier is a fine example. The quality of its carving, never excessive, is perfectly complemented by the richness of the patina acquired over more than two centuries. The subtle variations in the oak, the gently preserved traces of use and the harmonious proportions give the piece a remarkably inviting presence. It is the kind of furniture that naturally finds its place in a lived-in home, appealing as much for its beauty as for the story it continues to tell.
