Moroccan nimcha sword with strong European blade - Morocco, 17th century Beautiful, strong European blade from the 17th century. Typical 17th century blade frequently found in Europe mounted on Italian Italian Schiavonas, Scottish boadswords to Hungarian and Polish from Hungary and Poland. Blades that were obviously heavily exported and prized in North Africa, as they are frequently found mounted on 17th century nimchas. Probably Italian or Central European blade in view of the serrated eyelashes common below the back of the blade. Also engraved are Latin letters in the gutters. Single-edged straight blade with counter-edge on the last third. Horn handle. Missing ferrule at bottom of handle. Small accidents to horn. The whole remains solid, with no play. Overall length
