Chapelet in ebony-colored blackened wood, metal cross and medal, with its bone rosary bead (ox) depicting a Christ head and a Vanity, Mater Dolorosa and a Vanity, medal of the Mater Dolorosa and Saint Vincent de Paul, 19th century. This rosary is in good condition. It is marked on the medal "S. Vincentius A Paulo" (Saint Vincent de Paul*) and "Mater Dolorosa OPN" (Mother of Sorrow). Please note: all elements are 19th century elements are 19th century, but this rosary was remade in the 20th century (string instead of chain), wear and tear on the beads, see photos. photos. _____

de Paulo) are a society of apostolic life for women of pontifical right, initials F.d.I.C. instituted in 1633 by Saint Vincent de Paul Vincent de Paul, and whose formation was entrusted to Louise de Marillac, dedicated to the care of the sick and to the corporal and spiritual of the poor. The first sister was a cowherd named Marguerite Naseau, who had devoted herself since her youth to teaching girls. Throughout the 19th century and until the 1960s, the congregation of the Sisters of Saint Vincent de Paul were auxiliaries in hospices and asylums, at first on a massive scale, then from 1920, they were gradually replaced by nurses, psychiatric nurses and lay care assistants.
