Or, a phoenix sable perched on a pyre gules, with a chief azure charged with three shells argent. Material: Metal. Height: 6.5 cm. Width: 7.5 cm Depth: 0.5 cm Condition: Good condition The Viart family first appears in the history of the Blois region in the mid-14th century with Jehan (or Jean) Viart, mentioned as bailiff of Blois in 1342, during the reign of Count Louis I of Blois-Châtillon.
