pendantConditionVery good overall condition for a piece of this scale.The colored stones, set close together - which effectively protects them around their edges - are in good condition overall, with no major accidents. The emeralds have a few slight chips on their edges, inevitable with natural stones of this size and in keeping with their nature: they do not alter the color or legibility of the composition. The diamonds are flawless and untouched. There are slight traces of glue at the junction between the bouquet and the rock crystal, barely noticeable in normal wearing conditions.Worn, the brooch reveals its full interest: the golden rutile needles, discreet flat, come alive in the light and take on their full presence on the lapel of a garment. The color palette - from the green of emeralds to the violet of amethysts, from the blue of sapphires and aquamarines to the yellow of citrines - is dense without being dissonant. A piece that stands on its own.
